The purpose of this report is to provide Council with an update on the status of the Development Charges Background Study and By-Law update project timelines and annual indexing process.

*2. Gender Based Education

The consent of Council is requested for the withdrawal of New Motion 2.

Whereas women represent over 50% of the population across the country, but according to 2023 research conducted by the Canadian Municipal Barometer at the University of Calgary on behalf of Federation of Canadian Municipalities' Canadian Women in Local Leadership (CanWILL) program only 31% of municipal elected representatives; and

Whereas Dr. Tracey Raney reports via her Social Sciences and Humanity Research Council (SSHRC) funded research that women (and especially racialized women) are disproportionately targeted by violence and harassment and what's more, that the problem is ubiquitous throughout Canadian politics; and

Whereas Kingston City Council voted to support Private Member's Bill 5, Stopping Harassment and Abuse by Local Leaders Act in 2022; and

Whereas Kingston City Council voted on May 2, 2023 to support the call of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario for the Government of Ontario to introduce legislation to strengthen municipal Codes of Conduct and compliance with them in consultation with municipalities; and

Whereas violence against women and gender inequities exist locally to the extent that Kingston City Council passed a motion on October 17, 2023 declaring intimate partner violence an epidemic of which women disproportionately experience; and

Whereas gender equality is enshrined in the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms specifically Section 15 and Section 28, which is part of the Constitution of Canada, along with federal legislation of Canadian Labour Code Part II, Gender Budgeting Act, and the Employment Equity; and

Whereas gender equality means that diverse groups of women, men and gender diverse people are able to participate fully in all spheres of Canadian life, contributing to an inclusive and democratic society; and

Whereas Gender Based Analysis Plus (GBA+) is an analytical process that provides a rigorous method for the assessment of systemic inequalities, as well as a means to assess how diverse groups of women, men, and gender diverse people may experience policies, programs and initiatives; and

Whereas the Canadian Government has recently renewed its

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commitment in 2015, to GBA+, which first began in 1995, and is working to strengthen its implementation across all federal departments; and

Whereas the cities of Edmonton (2017), Halifax (2021) and Brampton (2023) have passed motions to support gender equity such as implementing mandatory GBA+ e-learning training for senior leaders in the Administration and/or for City Councillors utilizing the federal government's e-learning tool, and creating Women's Advocacy/Advisory Committees; and

Whereas the need for concrete action is critical to lessening gender inequity and eliminating violence against women;

Therefore Be It Resolved That Kingston City Council direct staff to:

- Implement mandatory Gender-based Analysis Plus (GBA+) elearning training for senior leaders in the administration and for City Council by the end of Q2 2025 that this training utilize the federal government's e-learning tool;
- Develop within the IIDEA Division a plan to address gender equity in Kingston that considers the possible establishment of a Women's Advisory Committee by no later than the end of Q4 2025.

Executive Summary:

Subsection 2(1) of the <u>Development Charges Act</u>, 1997 (the Act) authorizes municipalities to impose development charges in order to provide a viable capital funding source for infrastructure that is required to support future development in the municipality. The City collects development charges pursuant to By-Law Number 2019-116, "A By-Law To Establish Development Charges For The City Of Kingston" (Development Charge By-Law). To ensure the City can continue collecting development charges, the City is in the process of preparing a new development charges background study and by-law to replace the existing Development Charges By-Law.

A draft Development Charges Background Study and By-Law will be posted on the City's website on December 17, 2024. A public meeting to review the draft Development Charges Background Study And By-Law is scheduled for February 4, 2025, and the new by-law is scheduled to be in place for March 1, 2025.

By-Law Number 2019-116 currently provides for an annual indexing on the first day of January in accordance with the non-residential building construction price index (Ottawa Region); however, the annual indexing process is normally not a requirement in the year that the

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background study and by-law are being updated. Because development charges will be appropriately increased on March 1, 2025, to align with the updated background study calculations and related by-law, an annual indexing factor will not be applied to the current charges on January 1, 2025.

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Options/Discussion:

Background

On September 3, 2019, Council passed By-Law Number 2019-116, "A By-Law To Establish Development Charges For The City Of Kingston" (Development Charge By-Law), which allows development charges to be collected by the City as a viable capital funding source for growth related infrastructure. On September 3, 2024, Council amended the existing Development Charges By-Law to extend the effective term until such time as a new by-law could be passed. The extension amended the timelines for the development charges background study project, allowing for additional public engagement including a more thorough review and consultation with the development community.

Representatives from Watson & Associates Economists Ltd. have been working with City staff to develop the new background study and by-law. The background study must be made available for public review for at least 60 days before by-law adoption and the City must hold a public meeting to present the background study and consider any feedback. A draft Development Charges Background Study and By-Law will be posted on the City's website on December 17, 2024. A public meeting is scheduled for February 4, 2025 and the new by-law is scheduled to be in place for March 1, 2025.

Analysis

The current Development Charges By-Law Number 2019-116 provides for an annual indexing of the charges on the first day of January in accordance with the non-residential building construction price index (Ottawa Region). However, the annual indexing process is normally not a requirement in the year that the background study and by-law are being updated.

With the extension of the Development Charges By-Law's effective term into the subsequent year, the indexing clause remains in effect; however, recognizing that the development charges will be reset subsequent to adoption of the by-law, based on the updated growth capital requirements and growth projections included in the background study, an annual indexing factor will not be applied to the current charges on January 1, 2025.

Additional meetings with the development community as well as a public open house are being scheduled in January 2025 to review the draft background study, with a virtual public open house scheduled for January 15, 2025. At the public meeting scheduled for February 4, 2025, representatives from Watson & Associates Economists Ltd. will provide Council with a briefing on the draft background study and by-law.

Should the increase to the development charges be delayed as a result of an appeal or any other unanticipated delays in implementing the updated development charges, staff will apply an indexing adjustment to the current rates on March 1, 2025, as provide for in the current by-law.

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Existing Policy/By-Law

By-Law Number 2019-116, A By-Law To Establish Development Charges For The City Of Kingston, Cited As The "City Of Kingston Development Charge By Law 2019".

Financial Considerations

The City will continue to collect development charges at the current development charge rates until the new bylaw comes into effect.
